INFORMATION FOR THE PROSPECTIVE FOSTER FAMILY

Dogs adopted through Greyhound Pets of America/Louisville Chapter, will come to their foster home already spayed/neutered, with a DHLLP-PARVO inoculation, a rabies shot, a fecal analysis, teeth cleaned and a heartworm check, all performed by a licensed Veterinarian. It will be the responsibility of the foster family to take the Greyhound to GPA's Veterinarian for their microchip.

GPA will provide food and any supplies and will be responsible for all reasonable medical expenses needed during the foster period.

**** Concerning heartworm: If our veterinarian's heartworm check shows a dog is positive for heartworms, Greyhound Pets of America/Louisville Chapter will not place the affected dog in a foster or pet home. We cannot, in good faith, place a dog in a foster or adoptive home if the animal will need the prolonged and expensive medical care that heartworm treatment involves.
